NOTICE OF RACE

1 Rules

The racing will be governed by the 'rules' as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2009-2012. The principle language used will be English.

2 Eligibility & Entry

Entry is open to any yacht. The principal handicapping system used will be IRS. Any boats using another ratings system will be issued a provisional IRS equivalent rating.

Entry Fees – The entry fee is 5 Euros per person or 18 Euros per person including T-shirt and dinner.

The Prize Giving will be on the stage at the outer harbour in Vassiliki. This will start at 2100 with Greek Folklore, the prize giving at 2230 followed by live music featuring Wizard Sleeve.

Parent/Guardian

Declarations

All helms and crews who are under 18 years of age must submit declarations signed by their parent or guardian.

Television and Media

Competitors automatically grant to the organising authority without payment the right in perpetuity to make, use and show any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television of or relating to the events.

3 Schedule

The race will start at 12:00 from the start line outside Vassiliki Harbour. There will be other starts involving dinghies and catamarans on the same start line. The yacht race will be the first start after the finishing of the 1st laser, catamaran and open dinghy race.

4 Sailing Instructions

5 Prizes

Trophies/Medals will be awarded to at least the first three competitors in each category.

6 Statement of Liability

Competitors are entirely responsible for their own safety, whether afloat or ashore, and nothing reduces this responsibility. It is for competitors to decide whether their boat and its helm and crew are fit to sail in the conditions that they might find. By launching or going to sea competitors confirm their boat is fit for those conditions and that they are competent to sail and compete in them. Nothing done by the organisers can reduce the responsibility of the owners and/or competitors, nor will it make the organisers responsible for any loss, damage, death or personal injury, however it may have occurred, as a result of the boat taking part in the racing. The organisers encompass everyone helping to run the event. The provision of patrol boats does not relieve owners and competitors of their responsibilities.

7 Insurance

Boats are required to be adequately insured including insurance against third party claims – under Greek law for a minimum of 200,000 Euros.
